

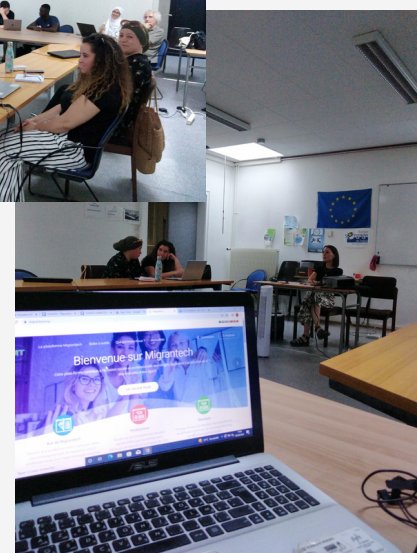
## ALL GOOD THINGS MUST COME TO AN END... OR MUST THEY ? LOCAL E-TUTORS TRAINING

After two years of work from AMSED and its partners Familles du Monde, Anatolia Youth Association and Factor Social, the MIGRANTECH project is coming to an end. With the e-modules being uploaded and the final touches made, the work seemed almost complete. Yet, with the intention of having our material benefitting as many people as possible and making the results of the project sustainable, a final phase remained to be implemented. With the platform up and running, and the ever-so-carefully chosen skills available for all to learn or study, it was decided to call on employment and inclusion professionals who, through training sessions organized by us, will become e-tutors, fit to guide news users through courses selected for them, to help them get the best of what the platform can offer.

After the transnational e-tutors training in Turkey, the first local workshop took place in Strasbourg on August 3rd, in AMSED's office. Consisting of a reminder of where the project had started, from the initial survey to the setting up the online platform and creation of the modules, not forgetting the elaboration of the Good practices manual and the transnational training of e-tutors.

Then, followed the introduction of the platform to the yet uninitiated professionals that had joined us. All got to browse, go through a couple modules each, supported by the e-tutors already trained in Turkey.

Finally, we discussed the role and responsibilities an e-tutor should have to support the learners, as well as the skills, abilities and knowledge necessary to accompany the migrant and refugee public in their learning path.



While each partner is organizing these local training sessions in their country, AMSED will set up another in the next few weeks. Once our transnational team of e-tutors is ready, the very last activity of the project will be the organization of final conferences to present our project and all its results to the relevant stakeholders and general public.
